# WHAT is maritime pilotage?



- Throughout the world, pilots are trained experts in ship navigation in specific waters and possess knowledge of local conditions/waters
- In Canada, pilotage dates back to early colonial days and exists on the St. Lawrence River for over 200 years



# Pilotage in Canada



- In 1972, Pilotage Act created four Pilotage Authorities to operate and maintain safe and efficient pilotage services in designated areas
- The Act lays out:
  - Principles for provision of pilotage services;
  - Mandate and powers of the Pilotage Authorities
  - Fee charging process

# Principles and mandates under the Pilotage Act

#### Pilotage services in Canada must align with following principle:

- Promotes and contributes to the **safety of navigation**, including the safety of the public and marine personnel, that **protects human health**, **property and the environment**;
- Be provided in an **efficient and cost-effective** manner;
- Risk management tools used effectively, and evolving technologies taken into consideration
- pilotage charges be set at levels that allow the Authority to be **financially self-sufficient** (s. 2 of the Act)

### Objects of the Pilotage Authorities are to:

 Establish, operate, maintain and administer, in the interests of safety of navigation, an efficient pilotage service within their respective region (s. 18 of the Act)

In compulsory pilotage areas, the pilot (licensed or certificate holder) has the "conduct" of the ship (s. 38.01 of the Act)



# Headquarter in downtown Montreal




- The largest pilotage authority in Canada among the four existing in the country.
- Administers and provides marine pilotage services as well as related services in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, the St. Lawrence River, and the Saguenay River.


### In accordance with its legislative mandate:



### **Notices of arrival**


- For ships arriving from the sea or the Gulf of St. Lawrence

### **Notices of departure**

For all ships in the compulsory pilotage areas

### Notices of movage

 For all ships to make a movage in the Port of Montréal or Port of Québec





- In the 4 others ports, our partner Groupe Océan acts as our subcontractor










# A state-of-the-art simulator that is continually evolving

- The physical environment and maneuverability of internally modeled ships are realistically reproduced.
- Used for research and development:
  - To enhance navigation/piloting best practices
  - For incident studies
  - For specific training purposes







# Liability



His Majesty, or an Authority is not liable for any damage or loss occasioned by the fault, neglect, want of skill or wilful and wrongful act of a licensed pilot or a pilotage certificate holder

A licensed pilot who meets the conditions of their licence is not liable in damages in excess of \$1,000 for any damage or loss occasioned by their fault, neglect or want of skill.

Same limitation of liability for the pilot's Corporation



**1972** Pilotage Act



#### 2024 – all of the provisions of the amended Act now in effect BUT



Regulatory environment still under development including framework for:

- 1) the Authorities' risk management system;
- 2) modernization of risk assessments, national approach to pilot certification

Division of responsibilities between Authorities and TC still undergoing clarifications

Legislative framework in transition

New set of principles framing the implementation of the Act (efficiencies, cost effectiveness, use of risk management tools and consideration of evolving technologies, etc)

Regulatory and enforcement powers along with issuance of licenses transferred to TC

Greater delineation of content of contracts for pilotage services and transparency

**2029** Next rewiew of the Act
